



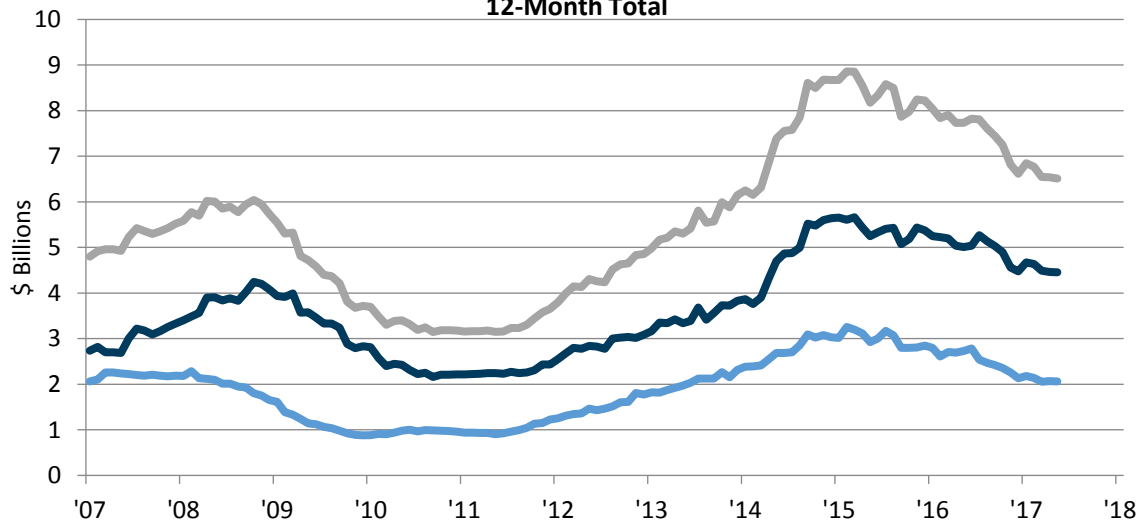

- City of Houston building permits totaled \$572.2 million in May '17, down 3.9 percent from \$595.7 million in May '16, according to the latest data released by the city's Department of Public Works & Engineering Planning & Development Services.
- For the 12 months ending May '17, city building permits totaled \$6.5 billion, down 15.7 percent from \$7.7 billion in the 12 months ending May '16.

Over-the-year losses occurred in both commercial and residential construction in May. The value of non-residential building permits decreased 2.7 percent from \$384.4 million in May '16 to \$374.1 million in May '17. Residential building permits decreased 6.3 percent from \$211.3 million in May '16 to \$198.1 million in May '17.
