- The Houston-Galveston Customs District recorded trade valued at \$233.3 billion for '18, up 21.5 percent from \$192.0 billion in '17. Houston's top 20 trade partners were responsible for 71.2 percent, or \$166.1 billion, of the region's foreign trade in '18.

- In '18, Houston was the largest U.S. customs district based on vessel weight, ahead of New Orleans and Los Angeles, and the second largest based on vessel value, behind Los Angeles.
